

Thomas Wirth, MD, PhD, is currently Director of the Department of Orthopaedics at the Olghospital in Stuttgart, one of the largest paediatric hospitals in Germany and is Professor of Orthopaedic Surgery at the Philipps University of Marburg. He previously worked in both the Women's and Children's Hospital in Adelaide, Australia as well as Addenbrooke's Hospital, Cambridge. He was President of the German Association of Paediatric Orthopaedics from 2008 to 2014. He is Councillor of the German Society of Orthopaedics and Orthopaedic Surgery (DGOOC) and a member of the International Paediatric Orthopaedic Think Tank (IPOTT). In 2014, he was awarded the Golden Honorary Needle of the German Society of Orthopaedics and Orthopaedic Surgery in recognition of his contribution to Paediatric Orthopaedics.

Prof. Thomas Wirth became EPOS member in 2002 and served the Society as Treasurer from 2012 until 2016. He was elected 2nd Vice-President in April 2017 and has started his one-year term as EPOS-President in April 2019 in Tel Aviv. Currently is still acting as Interim EPOS President until the end of this term in April 2021.

He has an active research interest in the basic science of the growth plate, paediatric hip disorders, paediatric trauma and the use of arthroscopy in children's orthopaedics. His main clinical work furthermore includes the treatment of children with skeletal dysplasias, osteogenesis imperfecta, spine disorders and benign and malignant bone tumours. On these topics he has published around 100 articles and written more than 20 book chapters.
